JONAS BEERTS was born in the summer of 1997.

He has been a briceleur of images and ideas ever since.

As a Stone cold lover of photography, he is cunningly busy stumbling over the pile of possible media.

Jonas Loves Sarah, and vice versa.

From time to time, their love turns inside out and takes the shape of a shared artistic practice.

They go under: Sarah & Jonas or Jonas & Sarah.

Whatever floats your boat.

All of a sudden, his eyes are attracted by two lovebirds on a

windowsill across the street.

His head drifts away through the open window.

He invites you to follow.



In 'Perpetuum Broodbile', the artist duo Sarah & Jonas depicts the metamorphosis of the grain of wheat by means of a collage using salt dough as base material. The image explores the asymmetry between man as a consuming being and the resources consumed. In addition, the grain of wheat in its various guises builds a bridge between the exhibition site—making place is the former grain milling factory de Molens van Orshoven—and the loaves of bread that are frequently present in Dieric Bouts' oeuvre.

The work unfolds as a diptych. Along one side, the game board without beginning or end, where wheat transforms autonomously from seed to bread before decomposing again in a system of anonymous entrails. In the second part, the perspective shifts and we see pawns and players appearing around the board. The transformation then seems to be played and not itself after all.

# what does the volcano say? 2023 (in progress)




What does the volcano say? is an immersive ritual within a participative video installation that allows a small group of people to gather around a dying volcano and bring up memories from its past life. In this poetical narrative and environment, an organic network of natural, human and technological intelligence is established. We try to spark the viewer's imagination and strengthen the connection with nature through stories as a form of poetical activism.

Immersed in a 360°-projection of a 3D-rendered landscape stands a performer personifying the volcano. In the middle of the space lies a game board sized landscape that visually and technologically connects to the surrounding landscape. A webcam in the landscape feeds an image recognition software, implemented in Touchdesigner software. Through playing cards participants can trigger videos, activating the volcano's memory.















2022 (prototype) is a prototypal landscape-machine on game board scale. It speculates a state of affairs that has been built on the ruins of the past, balances on the flip side of the present, and tumbles into the future. It consists of three main players. Firstly: the realm of big tech companies, invisibly controlling everyday day life through algorithms. Second: daily life itself, where apple juice and apple pies celebrate homeliness. And finally: the earth, that has come to boiling point and is getting back at the creatures that live on it, pulling them inside, and digesting them.





















# THE PLANT MORE TREES RADIO SHOW 2022 - ongoing





THE PLANT MORE TREES RADIOSHOW is a hybrid video performance. The video input is manipulated live to the tones of live activated audio fragments.







In the context of the project Re-gard gardening, Collectief zat invited artist duo Jonas & Sarah with their Eternal Garden.







DURATION single channel - 1:34:27 multichannel - variable Comment Aller Au Chel? is an almost epos-like video work which houses a hybrid world, inhabited by a collection of mysterious figures. The characters seem to be isolated, locked in their own archaic image, wearing an odd geometrical costume, and echoing a storytelling tradition.

A knight in a triangular shaped suit is fighting against his tears, thinking about his younger self.

The Mother of Storkes is taking her last bath. Bones crack as her memory fades. The refined network of stories fallss apart. Her words fuse with the tides of the sea.

The King of No-man's-land is rehearsing his solemn movements for past grandeur.

A Man of the Forest has been hiding in a corridor, not knowing how to deal with the walls surrounding him.

A group of revolutionaries calls itself Les Liberateurs.
While there is nothing to be revolutionized, they return to old Bourgoisist routine, eat croissants, and present their new set of rules: 'Les Règles de base'.


A Sulted Person, pretending to be someone he is not, is me. He is your guide, will take you to the heart of this Labyrinth.

While the camera moves through hallways, tunnels and rooms, tableaus are presented, and the spectator is led into the storylines and images they contain.




















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
